ABOUT THE FELLOWSHIP

In 1997, an endowment was established at Appalachian by Mr. William R. Holland and United Dominion industries to support this student experience. This endowment serves to offset the cost of the fellowship. Students earn six hours of course credit during the spring and summer I sessions.

SELECTION PROCESS

Twelve Appalachian business majors are selected annually through a competitive interview process. Successful completion of the Holland Fellows Program earns an official transcript notation. Participation is limited to full-time juniors, seniors and graduate students admitted to the Walker College of Business with a GPA of 3.0 or better. Applications are available on-line with a mid-September deadline.
